STIPULATION AND ORDER DISMISSING ACTION

COME NOW the staff of the Idaho Department of Insurance ("Department") and INSURANCE COMPANY OF NORTH AMERICA (hereinafter "ICNA") and do hereby agree and stipulate as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. ICNA is a Pennsylvania-domiciled insurer authorized to transact certain lines of insurance in the state of Idaho pursuant to Idaho Certificate of Authority No. 473, initially issued

on August 7, 1956. ICNA is subject to the provisions of title 41, Idaho Code, and to the rules of the Idaho Department of Insurance promulgated thereunder.

- 2. The Director of the Department ("Director") has jurisdiction over ICNA and the subject matter herein pursuant to provisions of the Idaho Insurance Code, Idaho Code §§ 41-101 et seq.
- 3. On October 12, 2021, the Department filed a Verified Complaint and Notice of Right to Hearing (hereinafter "Verified Complaint"), seeking imposition of administrative penalties.
- 4. The parties agree that this matter may be brought to a close by a negotiated and stipulated settlement and entry of this Stipulation and Order Dismissing Action.

AGREEMENT

- 5. Based upon the foregoing, ICNA and the Department stipulate and agree as follows:
 - a. ICNA admits to violating Idaho Code § 41-1812(1).
 - b. ICNA and the Department agree that ICNA should pay an administrative penalty of \$1,000.
 - iCNA and the Department agree that, upon payment of the administrative penalty,
 this action should be dismissed with prejudice.
- 6. By entering into this Stipulation, ICNA knowingly and voluntarily waives any rights it would otherwise have to notice and a hearing at which he may be represented by counsel, present evidence, and examine witnesses. The parties hereto further waive their right of reconsideration, appeal, and other rights as set forth in title 67, chapter 52, Idaho Code, including the right to submit this matter for review by a court of competent jurisdiction.

- 7. The parties agree that the terms of this Stipulation and Order Dismissing Action are appropriate and proper under the circumstances referenced herein.
- 8. ICNA acknowledges that it has read this Stipulation and Order Dismissing Action and understands its contents; that it has been given the opportunity to discuss this Stipulation and Order Dismissing Action with independent legal counsel of its choosing; and that it has entered into this Stipulation knowingly, voluntarily, and with full knowledge of any rights it may be waiving thereby.
- 9. ICNA acknowledges that this is an administrative action that may be required to be reported on license applications and license renewal forms and disclosed to other agencies through which ICNA holds a license.
- 10. This Stipulation is subject to approval by the Director or the Director's designee, and shall become effective and binding upon the Department and ICNA upon such approval. Should the Director decline to approve this Stipulation and Order Dismissing Action, the Department and ICNA shall retain all of their rights, claims and/or defenses, and any factual and/or legal admissions made by ICNA herein shall be withdrawn.
- 11. This Stipulation constitutes the full and final resolution of all matters addressed herein, and the Department agrees that, subject to the Director's approval described above, the Department shall seek no further civil or administrative sanctions for the violations alleged in the Verified Complaint, Docket No. 18-3976-21, subject to the agreement set forth in Paragraph 5 above.
- 12. ICNA agrees that, upon execution of this Stipulation and Order Dismissing Action, no subsequent action or assertion shall be maintained or pursued in any manner asserting the invalidity of this Stipulation and Order Dismissing Action and its provisions.

- 13. This Stipulation and Order Dismissing Action embodies the entire agreement between the Department and ICNA, and there are no agreements, understandings, representations, or warranties that are not expressly set forth herein.
- 14. Upon the Director's entry of the Final Order approving this stipulation, this Stipulation and Order Dismissing Action shall be a public record under the Idaho Public Records Act.
