SUMMARY ORDER REVOKING IDAHO NONRESIDENT INSURANCE PRODUCER LICENSE

The Director of the Idaho Department of Insurance ("Director") has received notice of the entry of an order by the Texas Commissioner of Insurance revoking the Texas resident insurance license issued to MARCO ANTONIO VASQUEZ. Upon review of such order, and pursuant to Idaho Code § 41-1016(2)(a), the Director enters this Summary Order revoking VASQUEZ's Idaho Nonresident Insurance Producer License No. 732667.

## **FINDINGS OF FACT**

- 1. VASQUEZ, at all times relevant hereto, held a Texas resident insurance license.
- 2. On or about August 12, 2021, the Texas Commissioner of Insurance issued Default Order No. 2021-6959 in Docket No. 454-21-2826, revoking VASQUEZ's Texas resident insurance license based in part upon findings that VASQUEZ submitted at least 22 altered prior carrier experience letters to qualify customers for lower premium rates on their auto policies.
- 3. VASQUEZ has been licensed as an Idaho nonresident insurance producer, holding license number 732667, which was initially issued on July 29, 2019.

#### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 4. Idaho Code § 41-1016(2)(a) provides that the Director shall, without hearing, suspend for not more than 12 months, or shall revoke or refuse to continue any insurance producer license issued under title 41, chapter 10, Idaho Code, where the Director has received a final order of suspension, revocation or refusal to continue issued by the insurance regulatory official or court of jurisdiction of the licensee's home state.
- 5. The Director finds that the above circumstances justify the revocation of VASQUEZ's Idaho nonresident insurance producer license, pursuant to Idaho Code § 41-1016(2)(a).

#### **ORDER**

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Idaho Nonresident Insurance Producer License No. 732667 issued to VASQUEZ is REVOKED effective immediately.

### NOTIFICATION REGARDING REPORTABLE PROCEEDINGS

This is considered a reportable administrative proceeding. online searchable database. Be aware that this proceeding must be disclosed on any license application and must be reported to any and all states in which you hold an insurance license.

#### **NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS**

This is a final order of the agency. Any party may file a motion for reconsideration of this final order within 14 days of the service date of this order. The agency will dispose of the motion for reconsideration within 21 days of its receipt, or the motion will be considered denied by operation of law. *See* Idaho Code § 67-5246(4).

Any such motion for reconsideration shall be served on the Director of the Idaho Department of Insurance, addressed as follows:

Pursuant to Idaho Code §§ 67-5270 and 67-5272, any party aggrieved by this final order or orders previously issued in this case may file a petition for judicial review in the district court of the county in which:

- i. A hearing was held;
- ii. The final agency action was taken;
- iii. The party seeking review of the order resides, or operates its principal place of business in Idaho; or
- iv. The real property or personal property that was the subject of the agency action is located.

A petition for judicial review must be filed within 28 days of: (a) the service date of this final order, (b) the service of an order denying motion for reconsideration, or (c) the failure within 21 days to grant or deny a motion for reconsideration, whichever is later. See Idaho Code § 67-

5273. The filing of a petition for judicial review does not itself stay the effectiveness or enforcement of the order under appeal. Idaho Code § 67-5274.
