Application for Permit to Operate Flame Effects INSIDE Buildings and OUTDOORS on Before a Proximate Audience

INSTRUCTIONS

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All Information must be printed in ink or typed.

Submit only one (1) copy of this application and all its attachment(s) to the SFMO. The SFMO must be in receipt of this application not less than 15 days prior to event.

- Line 1. Provide name of person or company applying for flame effect permit.
- **Line 2.** List telephone number where applicant may be reached.
- **Line 3 & 3b.** Use mailing address the applicant can expect the quickest delivery service. If available, provide an email address.
- **Line 4.** What is the physical address (location) of the permit applicant if it is different from the mailing address give.
- Line 5. List city, state and zip code for the complete mailing address.
- **Line 6.** Provide the applicant vendor's Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN) as provided by the IRS.
- **Line 7.** Print the name of the person who is representing the applicant listed on Line 1 and whose signature appears on Line 16.
- **Line 8.** Provisions contained in the Idaho Fire Code (IFC) and its incorporated NFPA 160 standard govern the use of flame effects before an audience. **This application is for a permit to use flame effects on a temporary basis**. For the flame effects that are to be used for a period greater than 180 days, the applicant should consult with the SFMO for further direction or information on permanent flame effects.
 - If in tandem with **Fireworks** A permit to use flame effects does not confer approval to use fireworks or pyrotechnics. To use fireworks or pyrotechnics in tandem with flame effects, a separate application is to be completed and submitted with this application as a package. If fireworks are to be used, check the box located in the note below Line 8.4.
 - Check each circumstance flame effects will be used and whether it will be inside or outside a building or both.
- **Line 9.1 through 9.3**. Print the name and address of the venue at which flame effects will be used along with the name and telephone number of the venue manager.
- Line 10. Provide the date and time-frame the use of flame effects will occur.
- **Line 10.1.** The box is to be checked if the use of flame effects will occur on multiple, consecutive dates. Checking the box for Line 10.1 is intended to apply **only** to those multi-day display that are identical in location, types and numbers of devices. If the dates are not consecutive, if the number and/or types of flame effects are not identical to the date before, or if identical device setups will occur at different locations or dates, new permit is required.

If multiple dates are planned for identical setups, list the additional dates and times on a separate sheet. Label or indicate at the top of the sheet that it's an attachment for Line 10.1.

- **Line 11.** The IFC provides an opportunity for the operator to prove to the fire official, sponsor and venue manager that the flame effects and devices will operate as planned and within the safety parameters required by the IFC. Designate a date and time at which a walk-through can begin and representative demonstration will be available.
- Line 12. Check the classification of the flame effects system as they are described in NFPA 160.
- **Line 13.1 and 13.2.** Provide the name and age of the operator who will be in responsible charge of the flame effects along with the name and age of any assistants.
- Line 13.3. A use permit shall authorize the use of only the number and types of flame effects in the venue specified.
- **Line 14 through 14.6.** A plan for the use of flame effects is to be submitted to the SFMO as part of the permit application. The plan is also to be readily accessible at the venue where flame effects will be used and is subject to inspection.

The specifics of the plan are to be in conformance with the standard. Once accepted, approved and a permit is issued, all subsequently additions and modifications are to be pre-approved before using any modified flame effects. The plan should account for each appropriate item for the circumstance the effect will be used.

- Line 14.1. Contains items that should be addressed in the plan and are common between indoor and outdoor flame effects.
- Line 14.2. Contains items that should be addressed and are specific to the outdoors
- Line 14.3. Contains items that should be addressed and are specific to the indoors.
- **Line 14.4.** Lists items the plan should address as they relate to the operator's knowledge, skills and abilities. It should also address the level of control the operator or performer have on the flame effects.
- Line 14.5. Lists items that deal with unattended effects.
- **Line 14.6.** Deals with the certification of costumes, set, scenery and rigging materials being inherently flame-retardant or have been treated to achieve flame retardancy when exposed to flame effects such items are exposed to or are in the area affected by a flame effect device.
- **Line 15.** Attestation that is largely self-explanatory but should be read carefully. Attention should be given to the "special instructions" in the box.

After initial review, a provisional permit will be issued. After a complete and satisfactory site inspection at the location and date indicated on lines 10 and/or 11, the SFMO representative in attendance will convert the provisional permit to a finalized permit.

I acknowledge and agree to comply with all applicable requirements of the Idaho Fire Code (IFC) and the referenced NFPA 160-11 standard governing the use of flame effects before an audience even those not specifically covered or expressed on this application.

I also acknowledge that if a permit is issued it shall be valid only at the location listed on the application for the specific date(s) and time(s) for which it is issued and will expire at 12:01 a.m. on the date(s) provided on Lines 10 and/or 10.1 whichever is later. (5.1.3.2)

If approved to proceed, I acknowledge that such approval in conditional upon continued compliance with the IFC. I further acknowledge and understand that any IFC violations identified after the provisional permit has been issued may result in denial of final permit issuance or immediate suspension or revocation of a permit.
