**ORDER PERMITTING DEVIATION
FROM 2020 WORKERS'
COMPENSATION RATES**

On or about October 11, 2019, the Idaho Department of Insurance (“Department”) received from GRANITE STATE INSURANCE COMPANY (“GRANITE STATE”), an Illinois-domiciled insurer licensed to transact workers’ compensation insurance in the state of Idaho pursuant to Certificate of Authority No. 291, and a member of the National Council on Compensation Insurance, Inc. (“NCCI”), a request for permission to deviate from the workers’ compensation rates filed by the NCCI for 2020 by a uniform percentage increase of fifteen percent (15%).

GRANITE STATE and the NCCI have each waived the right to a hearing on the deviation request.

The Department’s Director (“Director”), having reviewed and being fully apprised of GRANITE STATE’s request to deviate from the Idaho workers’ compensation premium rates filed by the NCCI for 2020, and the requirements of Idaho Code § 41-1614, has determined that the requested rate deviation is justified.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, pursuant to Idaho Code § 41-1614, that GRANITE STATE's request to deviate by a uniform percentage increase of fifteen percent (15%) from the workers' compensation rates filed by the NCCI for 2020, exclusive of terrorism and catastrophe rating values, is GRANTED. This deviation from the Idaho workers' compensation premium rates filed by the NCCI for 2020 shall take effect on January 1, 2020, and shall remain in effect for one year from that date unless terminated sooner with the approval of the Director.

NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS

This is a final order of the agency. Any party may file a motion for reconsideration of this final order within fourteen (14) days of the service date of this order. The agency will dispose of the motion for reconsideration within twenty-one (21) days of its receipt, or the motion will be considered denied by operation of law. See Idaho Code § 67-5246(4).

Any such motion for reconsideration shall be served on the Director of the Idaho Department of Insurance, addressed as follows:

Pursuant to Idaho Code §§ 67-5270 and 67-5272, any party aggrieved by this final order or orders previously issued in this case may file a petition for judicial review in the district court of the county in which:

- i. A hearing was held;
- ii. The final agency action was taken;
- iii. The party seeking review of the order resides, or operates its principal place of business in Idaho; or
- iv. The real property or personal property that was the subject of the agency action is located.

A petition for judicial review must be filed within twenty-eight (28) days of: (a) the service date of this final order, (b) the service of an order denying motion for reconsideration, or (c) the failure within twenty-one (21) days to grant or deny a motion for reconsideration, whichever is later. See Idaho Code § 67-5273. The filing of a petition for judicial review does not itself stay the effectiveness or enforcement of the order under appeal. Idaho Code § 67-5274.
