## SUMMARY ORDER REVOKING IDAHO NONRESIDENT INSURANCE PRODUCER LICENSE

The Director of the Idaho Department of Insurance ("Director") has received a final order from the Commissioner of Insurance of the State of Kansas ("Commissioner") revoking Ashley Nicole Deaver's ("Deaver") resident insurance producer license. For the reasons discussed below, the Director enters this Summary Order Revoking Deaver's Idaho Nonresident Producer License, No. 17876354.

### **FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. On January 25, 2023, the Commissioner issued a Summary Order of Revocation ("Order") against Deaver. In the Order, the Commissioner found that on July 27, 2021, Deaver submitted an application for a Kansas resident insurance producer license, an application fee and a fingerprinting fee ("licensing fees") to the Kansas Insurance Department ("KID"). Deaver was issued a resident insurance producer license no. 17876354, on August 17, 2021. After the issuance of Deaver's insurance producer license, the licensing fees were returned unpaid. Despite notification to Deaver that the licensing fees were to be paid within 15 days of the notice, the KID has been unable to secure payment from Deaver. The Commissioner also found that by failing to pay the required

licensing fees, Deaver demonstrated untrustworthiness or financial irresponsibility in violation of Kansas law.

2. Based on these findings, the Commissioner ordered Deaver to cease and desist from selling, soliciting, or negotiating insurance in Kansas and/or receiving associated compensation, after the effective date of the Order, February 12, 2023.

Deaver has been licensed as an Idaho nonresident insurance producer since December
 6, 2022.

#### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

1. Per Idaho Code § 41-1016(2)(a), the Director shall, without hearing, suspend for up to 12 months, or revoke or refuse to continue, any license issued to a nonresident under title 41, chapter 10, Idaho Code, if the Director has received a final order of suspension, revocation, or refusal to continue from the insurance regulatory official or court of jurisdiction of the licensee's home state.

2. These circumstances justify revoking Deaver's Idaho Nonresident Insurance Producer License under Idaho Code § 41-1016(2)(a).

#### ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Deaver's Idaho Nonresident Insurance Producer License is REVOKED, effective immediately.

## **NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS**

This is a final order of the agency. Any party may file a motion for reconsideration of this final order within 14 days of the service date of this order. The agency will dispose of the motion for reconsideration within 21 days of its receipt, or the motion will be considered denied by operation of law. *See* Idaho Code § 67-5246(4).

Any such motion for reconsideration shall be served on the Director of the Idaho Department of Insurance, addressed as follows:

Pursuant to Idaho Code §§ 67-5270 and 67-5272, any party aggrieved by this final order or orders previously issued in this case may file a petition for judicial review in the district court of the county in which:

- i. A hearing was held;
- ii. The final agency action was taken;
- iii. The party seeking review of the order resides, or operates its principal place of business in Idaho; or
- iv. The real property or personal property that was the subject of the agency action is located.

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A petition for judicial review must be filed within 28 days of: (a) the service date of this final order, (b) the service of an order denying motion for reconsideration, or (c) the failure within 21 days to grant or deny a motion for reconsideration, whichever is later. See Idaho Code § 67-5273. Filing a petition for judicial review does not, by itself, stay the effectiveness or enforcement of the order under appeal. Idaho Code § 67-5274.
