**SUMMARY ORDER REVOKING
IDAHO NONRESIDENT
INSURANCE PRODUCER LICENSE**

The Director of the Idaho Department of Insurance (“Director”) has received notice that the Wisconsin Commissioner of Insurance, Division of Market Regulation and Enforcement (“OCI”), has issued an *Order of Revocation* revoking all Wisconsin insurance licenses of Jalen Elliott, (“Elliott”). For the reasons discussed below, the Director enters this Summary Order Revoking Elliott’s Idaho Nonresident Producer License No. 18834111.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Elliott was licensed in his home state of Wisconsin as a resident insurance producer under National Producer No. 18834111.
2. On August 19, 2022, the OCI issued a final *Order of Revocation* in Case No. 22-C44639, revoking Elliott’s Wisconsin insurance licenses upon finding that he violated Wisconsin law by not paying delinquent taxes, effective September 19, 2022.
3. Elliott has been licensed as an Idaho nonresident insurance producer since October 25, 2021.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

4. Per Idaho Code § 41-1016(2)(a), the Director shall, without hearing, suspend for up to 12 months, or revoke or refuse to continue, any license issued to a nonresident under title 41, chapter 10, Idaho Code, where the Director has received a final order of suspension, revocation, or refusal to continue issued by the insurance regulatory official or court of jurisdiction of the licensee's home state.

5. These circumstances justify revoking Elliott's Idaho Nonresident Insurance Producer License under Idaho Code § 41-1016(2)(a).

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Elliott's Idaho Nonresident Insurance Producer License No. 18834111 is REVOKED, effective immediately.

NOTIFICATION REGARDING REPORTABLE PROCEEDINGS

NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS

This is a final order of the agency. Any party may file a motion for reconsideration of this final order within 14 days of the service date of this order. The agency will dispose of the motion for reconsideration within 21 days of its receipt, or the motion will be considered denied by operation of law. *See* Idaho Code § 67-5246(4).

Pursuant to Idaho Code §§ 67-5270 and 67-5272, any party aggrieved by this final order or orders previously issued in this case may file a petition for judicial review in the district court of the county in which:


- i. A hearing was held;
- ii. The final agency action was taken;
- iii. The party seeking review of the order resides, or operates its principal place of business in Idaho; or
- iv. The real property or personal property that was the subject of the agency action is located.

A petition for judicial review must be filed within 28 days of: (a) the service date of this final order, (b) the service of an order denying motion for reconsideration, or (c) the failure within 21 days to grant or deny a motion for reconsideration, whichever is later. See Idaho Code § 67-5273. Filing a petition for judicial review does not, by itself, stay the effectiveness or enforcement of the order under appeal. Idaho Code § 67-5274.
