**SUMMARY ORDER REVOKING  
IDAHO NONRESIDENT  
INSURANCE PRODUCER LICENSE**

The Director of the Idaho Department of Insurance (“Director”) has received a final order in which the Director of the South Carolina Department of Insurance (“SCDOI”) revoked Misty Mashburn’s resident producer license. For the reasons discussed below, the Director enters this Summary Order Revoking Mashburn’s Idaho Nonresident Producer License No. 20126950.

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. Mashburn was licensed in her home state of South Carolina as a resident producer under South Carolina Resident License No. 20126950.
2. On May 13, 2022, the state of Pennsylvania revoked Mashburn’s Pennsylvania nonresident producer license. Mashburn failed to timely notify the SCDOI of the administrative action.
3. On October 13, 2022, the SDCOI entered an order revoking Mashburn’s resident producer license.
4. Mashburn has been licensed as an Idaho nonresident insurance producer since November 9, 2021.

**CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

1. Per Idaho Code § 41-1016(2)(a), the Director shall, without hearing, suspend for up to 12 months, or revoke or refuse to continue, any license issued to a nonresident under title 41, chapter 10, Idaho Code, if the Director has received a final order of suspension, revocation, or refusal to continue from the insurance regulatory official or court of jurisdiction of the licensee's home state.

2. These circumstances justify revoking Mashburn's Idaho Nonresident Insurance Producer License under Idaho Code § 41-1016(2)(a).

**ORDER**

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Mashburn's Idaho Nonresident Insurance Producer License is REVOKED, effective immediately.

## NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS

This is a final order of the agency. Any party may file a motion for reconsideration of this final order within 14 days of the service date of this order. The agency will dispose of the motion for reconsideration within 21 days of its receipt, or the motion will be considered denied by operation of law. *See Idaho Code § 67-5246(4).*

Pursuant to Idaho Code §§ 67-5270 and 67-5272, any party aggrieved by this final order or orders previously issued in this case may file a petition for judicial review in the district court of the county in which:

- i. A hearing was held;
- ii. The final agency action was taken;
- iii. The party seeking review of the order resides, or operates its principal place of business in Idaho; or
- iv. The real property or personal property that was the subject of the agency action is located.

A petition for judicial review must be filed within 28 days of: (a) the service date of this final order, (b) the service of an order denying motion for reconsideration, or (c) the failure within 21 days to grant or deny a motion for reconsideration, whichever is later. See Idaho Code § 67-5273. Filing a petition for judicial review does not, by itself, stay the effectiveness or enforcement of the order under appeal. Idaho Code § 67-5274.
