

Open Enrollment for 2024 health insurance is open through December 15, 2023

The open enrollment deadline for Idahoans purchasing or changing their individual health coverage for 2024 is December 15. Open enrollment only happens once a year, from October 15-December 15. Now is your opportunity to adjust plans and review them carefully as networks and benefits have changed. DOI recommends consumers contact a licensed insurance agent for help evaluating various plan options and eligibility for cost-savings.

Protect Yourself from Improper Marketing during Medicare Open Enrollment



Market Oversight

DOI has reviewed and accepted the National Council on Compensation Insurance (NCCI) filing for a base rate reduction of 12.6% reduction in workers' compensation insurance. The decrease – which takes effect January 1, 2024 – marks the seventh consecutive year of rate decreases for Idaho employers and continues the overall downward trend of rates.



State Fire Marshal

equipment. The Idaho State Fire Marshal's Office is reminding all Idahoans to exercise extra care this Thanksgiving to prevent an unwanted and devastating fire. Here are a few tips to help you celebrate Thanksgiving: • Stay in the kitchen when you are cooking on the stovetop to keep an eye on the food.



- Stay in the home when cooking your turkey and check on it frequently.
- Keep children at least 3 feet away from the stove.
- Clear the floor of tripping hazards. • Keep knives and appliance electric cords out of reach from children.
- Keep matches and utility lighters out of the reach of children (up high in a locked cabinet).
- Never leave children alone in room with a lit candle.
- Make sure your smoke alarms are working. Test them by pushing the test button.
- **Deep frying a turkey?** Deep frying turkey poses extra special hazards and require constant supervision: • Fryers must be at least 10 feet away from anything that can burn.

• Children and pets should be forbidden from the cooking area to prevent any mishaps.

- Be familiar with cooking temperatures for the type of oil you are using. • Do not overfill the cooking pot for the size of turkey you are cooking.
- Do a test run with water! First place your turkey in the cooking pot and fill it with water, enough to cover the turkey. Remove the turkey and mark the water line. Dump out the water and dry off your turkey and pot. Fill
- your cooking oil to the mark on your pot and start your cooking process. • Make sure your turkey is completely thawed. Never deep fry a frozen turkey.
- Do not drop your turkey into the hot oil. The reaction can be explosive! Have an ABC class fire extinguisher immediately available.
- an alternative to frying your turkey in hot oil.
