# Medicare Medicaid Combined Plans and Idaho Medicaid Plus



# Dual Eligible – what is that?

A dual eligible (aka full-duals) means that a person is eligible for Medicare and Full Medicaid. Full duals must be 21 years of age or older and receive Medicare and *enhanced* Medicaid coverage.

Dual Eligibles are *not* individuals in a Medicare Savings Program (QMB is not Full Medicaid). Individuals in a MSP are known as Partial duals in Medicare.



# What health coverage options are available?

The Medicare Medicaid Coordinated Plan (MMCP) is a voluntary program that integrates Medicare and Medicaid benefits into a single healthcare plan. Duals may enroll or disenroll from this plan quarterly (the same as Medicare's SEP for individuals on Extra Help).

The **Idaho Medicaid Plus** plan is a mandatory program (if not already in an MMCP plan). It is only mandatory in designated counties in Idaho and there are some groups excluded from mandatory enrollment (tribal members, pregnant women, and Adult DD waiver individuals).

#### Which Counties?

#### **Mandatory IMPlus Counties:**

The next slide is the most current (as of 1/1/2020) list if counties that have mandatory IMPlus in place.

#### **Passive IMPlus Counties:**

On January 1, 2020 dual eligible participants that live in Adams, Benewah, Clark, Gooding, Jerome, Latah, Shoshone, Valley, and Washington county will be passively enrolled into IMPlus with Blue Cross of Idaho. Dual eligible participants will be enrolled on April 1, 2020 (90 days after the 1/1/2020 notice). Participants can choose to opt-out before the start date or anytime thereafter. If a participant chooses to opt-out their services will remain with Idaho Medicaid.

# Medicare Medicaid Combined Plans (MMCP)

#### What is an MMCP?

A partnership between Medicare and Medicaid to provide healthcare services to dual-eligible people in Idaho.

You may be more familiar with the term Special Needs Plans (SNPs). These are Medicare Advantage Plans for dual-eligible beneficiaries.



### Medicare Medicaid Combined Plans

How do they work?

Dually eligible beneficiaries have the option to choose a Special Needs Plan (aka MMCP), stay with original Medicare (& ID Med Plus as their secondary), or choose another Advantage plan.

SNPs are offered by:

- Blue Cross of Idaho True Blue Special Needs Plan
- Molina Healthcare of Idaho Molina Medicare Options Plus



# MMCP may come w/additional benefits

Why would beneficiaries consider using these plans?


- ✓ They cover most services offered by Medicare and Medicaid.


  (Some services are "carved out")
- ✓ The beneficiary uses a single card for all services.
- ✓ These are the only plans that coordinate between Medicare and Medicaid.
- ✓ May have a medication that is covered on the MMCP Plan that isn't covered on a Part D plan.



# How can we review these plans?


MMCP Plans can be reviewed, like any other Medicare Advantage Plan, using the Medicare Plan Finder at medicare.gov






## MMCP – Medicare Plan Finder

Checking the Add Special Needs Plan option is important – this will bring up the MMCP Plans available (if any) in the zip code entered






## MMCP – Medicare Plan Finder

Note: The True Blue Plan has an error in that it has a premium showing in the Plan Finder – this is incorrect and it is a \$0 premium plan





# How to enroll in MMCP Plans

# Can I enroll in the MMCP today, or do I have to wait to be enrolled in Idaho Medicaid Plus?

You can enroll in the MMCP today! Enrollment and disenrollment in the MMCP is allowed one time per quarter. Simply call the health plan of your choice, and they can take your application over the phone. It's that easy!

If you are a member of the MMCP you will not be required to enroll in the Idaho Medicaid Plus program.



## Idaho Medicaid Plus

Is an MMCP the same thing as Medicaid Plus coverage?

NO – Idaho Medicaid Plus is a different service

Offered by both of the companies that offer MMCP plans.

Idaho Medicaid Plus is a program for people who have Medicaid and Medicare, but only covers the *Medicaid* piece.



## Idaho Medicaid Plus

People can elect to join one or the other Medicaid Plus plans, but will be assigned to one or the other if they don't make a choice.

Only impacts their Medicaid services.....still would need drug coverage and some Medicaid services will remain "carved-out," meaning they will still be covered the way they are today. (i.e. medical transportation services will still be administered by MTM and dental benefits will be administered by MCNA).

If they are already in a MMCP plan, they will not be in the Medicaid Plus coverage and should not be contacted about enrolling in Medicaid Plus.

# How to enroll in Idaho Medicaid Plus plan

Duals receive an enrollment letter with a form in the mail. There are two ways in which to enroll:


- 1. Mail the enrollment form in the pre-addressed envelope.
- 2. Call Idaho Department of Health & Welfare @ (833) 814-8568

Note: Individuals *cannot* call the health plan to enroll in Idaho Medicaid Plus

When an individual first receives dual-eligible status they would make their choice (or be auto-enrolled) into either BC or Molina and have 90 days to switch if they choose. After the 90-day window they can only change their Idaho Medicaid Plus plan annually (Oct 15 – Dec 7)










# Visual Explanation "What cards will they have?" Option #2 (ID Medicaid Plus)




